The role of education in combating online violence



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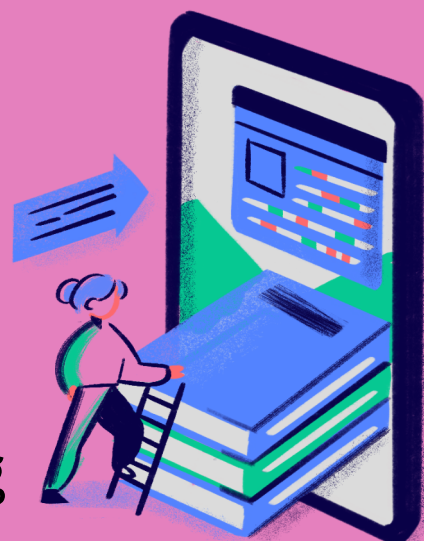
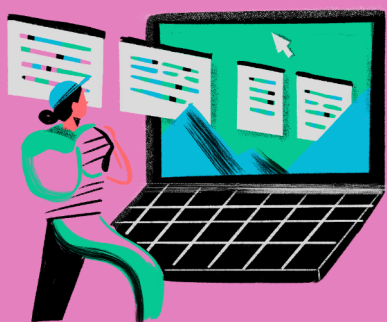

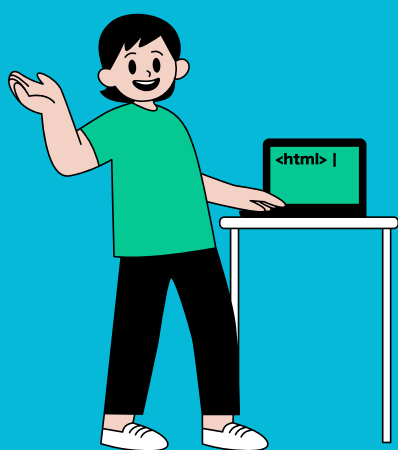
This highlights the critical need for education in order to navigate the ever-changing digital landscape.

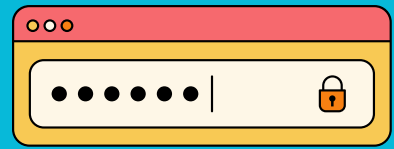




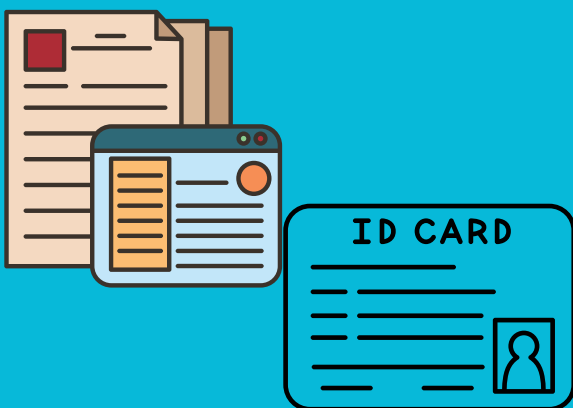
Education raises cybersecurity awareness which is important in combating online violence.

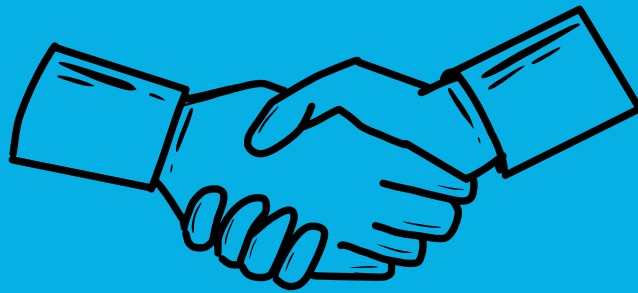
